The mission of KIPP Blytheville Collegiate High School (KBC) is to empower our students to develop the essential knowledge, skills, and character traits to pursue a college education and a life of value, joy, and integrity. KBC is a public charter school located in Blytheville, Arkansas, serving students in grades seven through twelve. The high school opened in 2014, and graduated its first class in 2018.

KIPP DELTA HISTORY

In 2002, KIPP Delta Public Schools opened its doors to eager fifth graders from across Phillips County, Arkansas. We have since expanded to serve over 1,350 students in six schools in three communities—Helena-West Helena, Blytheville, and Forrest City. KIPP Delta's values are High Expectations, Beyond Z, Humility, and Love & Care.

KIPP ACROSS THE NATION

KIPP has grown from two original schools to a national network of college-preparatory, public charter schools educating elementary, middle, and high school students. KIPP schools are free, public schools, and enrollment is open to all students. There are 224 KIPP schools in 20 states and the District of Columbia educating nearly 90,000 students on their path to and through college, careers, and life. KIPP believes that great teachers and school leaders, a supportive learning environment, and an emphasis on both academics and character are the foundation for student success. KIPP students complete college at a rate that is above the national average for all students and four times higher than that of students from similar economic backgrounds.
