## KIPP DELTA PUBLIC SCHOOLS DISTRICT-WIDE PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT POLICY

**2014-2015**

### **PART I: GENERAL EXPECTATIONS**

KIPP Delta Public Schools agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- The school district will put into operation programs, activities and procedures for the involvement of parents in all of its schools with Title I, Part A programs, consistent with Section 1118 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Those programs, activities, and procedures will be planned and operated with meaningful consultation with parents of participating children.
- Consistent with Section 1118, the school district will work with its schools to ensure that the required school-level parental involvement policies meet the requirements of Section 1118(b) of the ESEA, and each include, as a component, a School-Parent Compact consistent with Section 1118(d) of the ESEA.
- The school district will incorporate this district-wide parental involvement policy into its LEA plan developed under Section 1112 of the ESEA.

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## **PART II: DESCRIPTION OF HOW DISTRICT WILL IMPLEMENT REQUIRED DISTRICT-WIDE PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT POLICY COMPONENTS**

1. KIPP Delta Public Schools will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its district-wide parental involvement plan under Section 1112 of the ESEA:
  - i. Conduct an annual meeting by November 4th, 2014, at each community, facilitated by the Executive Director to discuss a district-wide parental involvement plan and to update policy for next year's Title I, Part A program. 3. KIPP Delta Public Schools will provide the following necessary coordination, technical assistance, and other support to assist Title I, Part A schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance:
  - i. Work closely with IT to ensure adequate access to technology*
  - ii. Coordinate with school directors to ensure the procurement of software to support the improvement in student academic achievement and school performance*

5. KIPP Delta Public Schools will take the following actions to conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parental involvement policy in improving the quality of its Title I, Part A schools. The evaluation will include identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in parental involvement activities (with particular attention to parents who are economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority background). The school district will use the findings of the evaluation about its parental involvement policy and activities to design strategies for more effective parental involvement and to revise, if necessary (and with the involvement of parents), its parental involvement policies. - iv. An annual meeting will be held to discuss the findings of the survey*
- v. Parents will be invited to attend and provide necessary feedback for improvement of parental involvement and the policy itself*
- vi. The superintendent or his designee will develop and disseminate an annual parent activity evaluation report at the end of the 2013-2014 school year to share with parents, staff, and the community.*

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6. KIPP Delta Public Schools will build capacity of school staff and parents to create strong parental involvement programs, in order to ensure effective



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involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school involved, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement. The following strategies will be used:

- A. The school district will, with the assistance of its Title I, Part A schools, provide assistance to parents of children served by the school district or school, as appropriate, in understanding topics such as the following, by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph:

*Each school will host parent pride nights, which will serve as an informational session for their student's progression and goals and equip parents with the tools necessary to assist with their student's progression towards those goals. The district will monitor those activities to ensure schools are fostering an environment conducive to parental involvement. The dates for these activities will be provided in the schools' parental involvement plans.*

- C. The school district will, with the assistance of its schools and parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal

- D.
